## Celebrating Celtic Heritage

Formed in March 1982 by five of the Celtic Communities in NSW with the vision of becoming over time a more Australia-wide body.

The Council aims to bring Celts of all backgrounds together to celebrate our shared heritage and culture and to support all Celtic communities and organisations in Australia in keeping cultures and traditions alive.

The Council founded and publishes the Australian Celtic Journal, and has encouraged the development of academic courses in Celtic Studies at universities and other centres.

In 1989 the Council mooted the idea of a National Celtic Monument and the fruition of this was The Australian Standing Stones in Glen Innes. The Council has been involved with many festivals and events in Australia.
